## Welcome!

To ensure everyone's safety, please observe the following guidelines. We will continue to follow the latest recommendations and monitor our local public health situation, and will revise these guidelines as needed:

Our ushers are here to create a welcoming and safe space for worship; please let them know if you have questions, need assistance, or become aware of a health or safety concern. They have hearing assist devices available for those who need them. We're glad you're here!

Children are always welcome to be in church with their families. We encourage you to sit up front, as they will be more engaged if they can see and hear what's going on. Children are welcome here just as they are; please don't feel you must leave every time your little one makes a sound! We have children's bulletins, books, and other quiet activities available in the narthex (the entrance with the red doors) for children's use during the service. A nursery staffed by high school students is available on Sunday mornings from 9 a.m. to noon; it also has a changing table and rocking chair for parents to use. [Note: There is no nursery care today as our nursery staff are participating in the pageant.] Sunday School is at 9:30 a.m. every Sunday for all ages.

**Covid safety at Christmas services:** We will continue to conduct services as safely as possible, and require masks for everyone attending services, regardless of vaccination status. Of our Christmas worship services, we expect the 4 p.m. Christmas Eve service to have the highest attendance. If you would prefer to avoid worshipping in a full church, we encourage you to attend the 11 p.m. Christmas Eve service and/or the 10 a.m. Christmas Day service instead. All services will also be livestreamed.

A note on year-end giving. We are so grateful for the pledge payments and other gifts that we receive in the final weeks of the year. For your contributions of cash or checks to appear on your 2021 year-end giving statement, they must be received in the St. John's office by Tuesday, December 28. If you would like to make an online pledge payment with your credit card and have it appear on your 2021 giving statement, please do so by Friday, December 24, so there is plenty of time for your contribution to clear the merchant account and our bank account in December. Stock transfers can take up to two weeks. Thank you for your generous support of St. John's.
